ANDROS LOZANO



Hash

In the waters of the Strait of Gibraltar, inequality is big business: thousands of tons of cannabis resin cultivated in the mountains of Morocco reach the Andalusian coasts in the form of bales of hashish, and from here they are distributed throughout Europe. The trafficking network spread along the Andalusian coast and through Ceuta and Melilla, addeding new goods such as cocaine, expanding its contacts to Colombian and Mexican cartels and European gangs, and penetrating institutions while becoming more violent and secretive.

In the regions with the highest unemployment in the European Union, the drug trade is an industry that employs thousands of workers.

Andros Lozano accompanies drug addicts who make a pilgrimage to Sanlúcar de Barrameda to buy *rebujito* (a cocktail of heroin and cocaine), he listens to the parents of young people killed in score settling, identifies corrupt police officers in the pay of the narcos, accompanies the agents of the Rapid Action Groups in their raids, travels on boats that cross the Strait at night laden with hash, and talks to judges, politicians and neighbours. With these pieces, he builds a devastating account of the mafias that are thriving on Europe's southern border.

GEMA PEÑALOSA

Gema was born in Andalusia in 1980. During her childhood, several notorius cases of violence against women stuck in her mind. Since then, she has not ceased asking herself why those cases left such a mark on her and how society reacted to them. It is very likely that these kinds of questions explain why she ended up dedicating herself to crime reporting and court journalism. First, in the Valencian Community. And later, in Madrid, where she currently covers the Ministry of the Interior for the newspaper *El Mundo*. She has investigated some of the most important corruption cases of recent years in Spain.

On October 17, 1998, El Pincelito, a sixty-two-year-old man, raped Verónica, a thirteen-year-old girl, in the Alicante town of Benejúzar. After the trial, El Pincelito was sentenced to prison. Six years later, when El Pincelito was on prison leave, Mari Carmen, Verónica's mother, came across him in the town and set him on fire. Days later, El Pincelito would die from his burns. Mari Carmen was convicted, but the court decision did not quell the debate between supporters and opponents of the mother taking the law into her own hands.

This book reconstructs the intricacies of that true story and explores its many ins and outs. Gema Peñalosa does not stop at this specific case, but also questions the social mechanisms that make it possible for women to continue to be subjected to so much sexual violence. The book explores the case, but goes

beyond simple reportage: it uses the best crime journalism to reflect on sexual violence against women and the just search for justice.

Massimo Di Ricco

Massimo is a university lecturer, historian and journalist. He holds a PhD in Mediterranean Cultural Studies and a Research Master's in Communication and Journalism from the Autonomous University of Barcelona. He has worked as a journalist in Spain, and reported as a correspondent from Lebanon and Egypt for Italian press. As a researcher and lecturer, he focuses on the role of transnational political actors in contemporary history, relations between the Middle East and Latin America, the politics of the Arab world, and critical approaches to international journalism. His articles have been published in academic journals and in outlets including *Al Jazeera, Middle East Eye, The National, El Espectador* and *Razón Pública*.

The Wretched of the Skies The hijackers' search for a Caribbean utopia

On 30 May 1973, two armed individuals, their faces covered by black hoods, hijacked an Electra HK-1274 aircraft operated by Colombian airline SAM, en route from Pereira to Medellín. The forgotten tale of the bizarre and lengthy hijacking of the SAM plane provides a narrative frame within which to tell the wider story of the wave of surreal hijackings that occurred in the golden age of skyjacking in Latin America, in the late 1960s and early 1970s, with Cuba the favoured destination. In a world characterized by calls for progress but divided by the Cold War, at a time of revolutionary political ideals and the emergence of the mass media, the skyjackers – who often came from humble backgrounds and were not necessarily overtly political – had utopian aspirations: they dreamed of starting a new life on an unknown and imagined island.

The text reconstructs the story of the two hijackers, and explores the true motives behind so many other skyjackings of the time. "They were not so much followers of Che Guevara as a cross between the downtrodden peasants of an Ignazio Silone novel, frustrated by the impossibility of influencing the changes transforming the society all around them, the streetwise hustlers of Pier Paolo Pasolini, willing to break the law to survive and enjoy whatever fleeting moments come their way, and the subalterns of Antonio Gramsci's theories, almost completely excluded from history."

DEL OLMO & FERNÁNDEZ

José María Olmo (Cartagena, 1981, on the left) heads the investigative section of *El Confidencial*. He has participated in the international investigations into the Panama Papers and the Falciani List, among other cases.

David Fernández (Madrid, 1975), a journalist since 2000, has worked for the newspapers 20 Minutos, El Confidencial and Infobae, among other. He is a member of the Association of Investigative Journalists (API) and has written two other books.

As the canons of investigative journalism dictate, *King Corp*. follows the money, while also recreating the corrupt atmosphere of an era and a country. In this sense, this book is a bestiary of the Spanish elites who became (even more) rich and powerful in the shadow of the king; a tale of crime and celebrity gossip through which drug dealers, Swiss lawyers and arms dealers (among others) parade; and an instruction manual to guide the rider through the labyrinth of financial scandals and judicial proceedings that threatened to put a king in the dock for the first time in the history of Spain.

It is also a detailed and vibrant account of the social, judicial and political collusion that allowed the head of state to accumulate hundreds of millions of euros in tax havens, use the state's assets

for his own benefit and play with the intelligence services as if they were his toy soldiers.

In addition to providing context and narrative texture to much of the information published in fragmentary form in recent years, Olmo and Fernández reveal assets, collaborators and details of Juan Carlos I's immense economic conglomerate that had remained hidden until now, after gaining exclusive access to bank documents, emails and photographs, as well as testimonies from bankers, businessmen, Zarzuela employees, military personnel, members of the secret services, close friends and those who examined Juan Carlos I.

MAR PADILLA

Mar was born in Barcelona, where she studied Anthropology and Journalism. As a young woman she was happy working as a DJ and sound technician at La Boîte, a dance and live music club in the upper part of the city. She spent a long time at Doctors Without Borders reporting about different international humanitarian crises. She has also worked at the Center for Contemporary Culture of Barcelona (CCCB) and on social projects in the most vulnerable neighbourhoods of her city. She contributes to El País, Altair Magazine, Jot Down and the magazine 5W. Asalto al Banco Central is her first book.



This book is a chronicle of a robbery with almost three hundred hostages locked up for more than thirty hours, an exploration of the political motives of the robbery and a portrait of a time, 1981, when Spanish democracy was still in its infancy.



Assault on the Central Bank

At 9:10 a.m. on Saturday, 23 May, 1981, a group of men armed with pistols and machine guns stormed the Central Bank of Barcelona, right in the centre of the city. They demanded the release of Lieutenant Colonel Tejero and others involved in the attempted coup d'état against the young Spanish democracy that had taken place only three months earlier, on 23 February 1981. They threatened to dynamite the bank with almost three hundred people inside. It was the beginning of the kidnapping with the most hostages in the history of Spain and one of the great mysteries of the Spanish democratic transition.

Who was behind the coup, what was its objective, was it a destabilizing conspiracy of the extreme right or the most imaginative armed robbery attempt in history? This brief and very complete book is a chronicle of more than thirty hours


of confinement, an investigation into the hidden reasons for the coup, a portrait of a time when democracy in Spain was still in the balance.

To solve this enigma, Mar Padilla has talked to the leader of the gang of robbers, José Juan Martínez (El Número Uno), prosecutors, judges, journalists, hostages and secret service spies, and from this volcano of contradictory accounts emerges an electric story with the flavour of an eighties movie.

Borja Lasheras

Borja (San Sebastián, 1981) has jumped from the Bay of Biscay to Central and Eastern Europe, via Netherlands and USA. He was international policy and security advisor for the Spanish Government (2018-2021) and before that was director of the Madrid Office of the European Council on Foreign Relations (ECFR). He currently serves as a senior research fellow in the Transatlantic Defense and Security programme at the Center for European Policy Analysis (CEPA) in Washington, DC. He spent several years as a youth working with the OSCE in the Balkans (Bosnia and Albania), which led him to write his first book, *Bosnia in Limbo: Testimonies from the Drina River* (2017, translated into English and into Ukrainian). He has written for media such as *El País*, *El Mundo* and *Letras Libres*.





Ukraine Station The country that was

The Russian invasion of Ukraine generated an urgent flood of new publications. This book does not belong to that category. It is not a reportage on the war or a rushed editorial assignment. Its author, Borja Lasheras, began writing it in 2016, after several years travelling around the country. Today it can be read as a portrait of the country that existed before 24 February 2022, the germ of the country that could be in the future: the country that emerged after the Maidan revolution and which, despite the war in Donbas, the economic crisis and endemic corruption, dreamed of a more "normal" future. In its pages appear activists, politicians, filmmakers, musicians and novelists who recount their aspirations, fears and frustrations. They are the visible faces of a generation whose enthusiasm is always tempered by the threat of disenchantment.

Their reverse side are the ageing alcoholics those who are nostalgic for the Soviet era, the survivors of a border region hit by all the geopolitical earthquakes of the last century and a half.

Combining melancholy and enchantment, Ukrainian Station possesses the best qualities of the finest travel literature and political narrative.

PAZ VELASCO DE LA FUENTE

Paz was born in Valladolid in 1968. Graduated in Law, Criminology and Criminal Policy and Master's Degree in Documentary Scrutiny, Graphistics and Documentary Forgery, she is a specialist in criminological evaluation, psychopathic personality and violent crimes. She is also the President of Madrid's College of Criminology Committee of Experts and teacher, occupations that she combines with creating content for her successful blog Criminal-mente. She has published *Criminalmente* (more than 20.000 copies sold in Spain) and *Homo Criminalis*.





No accidental Deaths A decalogue of reasons to kill

All murders look similar. Ultimately, they all involve the death of an innocent person. What gives them their uniqueness, their very personal stamp, are the motives that prompt an individual to commit them. And what troubles us is to discover those factors that lead someone to become a ruthless killer. Unraveling the motivations behind criminal acts —which are more than often difficult to explain— is the purpose of this new book by jurist and criminologist Paz Velasco.

Greed, sexual frustration, the desire to sow terror or the longing to battle loneliness are some of the reasons behind murder unraveled in this captivating stories. As a sort of decalogue, the author hereby develops ten non-accidental models of killing, ten

truculent tales in which once again Paz Velasco displays her rigor, her analytical skills, and her vast knowledge of the criminal mind. The darkest side of the human being is here masterfully dissected without any concessions.

MARC CASALS

Marc (Girona, 1980) was studying to become a translator and interpreter for the EU until, in 2004, fate took him to the Balkans and changed his life. Since then, he has lived in Bulgaria, Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina, has travelled throughout the Balkan peninsula, and has learned several of the region's languages. When he visited Bosnia, it was love at first sight, and he moved there in 2010 and started writing this book in 2015. Along the way he has published articles in El País, etxt and El Orden Mundial.



A first-hand account of a country whose history is among the most traumatic in Europe. This book is not the product of a couple of chats with its protagonists but reflects, instead, friendships that in some cases go back a decade or more.



Stone Remains

Between April 1992 and December 1995, the small country of Bosnia-Herzegovina was the scene of a war that caused almost a hundred thousand deaths and displaced some two million people. All under the uncomprehending gaze of the people of Europe and the paralysis of their leaders. The international media seized on the legend of the "Balkan powder keg" to explain something that appeared to be inexplicable.

Writing with the intuition and empathy of someone who has spent fifteen years living in the Balkans, Marc Casals deciphers the political enigma of a region that is still devastated by the aftermath of the conflict. He debunks toxic clichés, such as the supposedly warlike character of the region's inhabitants. In their place, he paints delicate miniatures of sixteen Bosnians – of Muslim, Croat or Serbian descent, Jews, people

with a Montenegrin or Turkish background – whose biographies constitute a fragmented and contradictory portrait, one that defies categorization. They are intimate stories of resistance and reconstruction, the result of many years of conversations and friendship between the author and the protagonists: David Kamhi, a Sephardi violinist; Alma, a night club singer; Fazila, a flower seller at Potocari cemetery; Ratko, poet, playwright and filmmaker, among others.

It isn't possible to condense a whole country into one book. *Stone Remains* attempts the opposite: to expand it.

Fariña (Cocaine Coast) How Cocaine Came to Europe

In the 1980s, Europe's cocaine trade was in full swing. Controlled by powerful Columbian cartels, much of this cocaine was smuggled in through the ports and fishing villages of Galicia in north-western Spain, where smuggling has been a way of life for generations. Then the drug trade offered a way out of poverty and unemployment for many, but also unleashed a wave of addiction and violent crime. But even today, the drug runners remain a feared presence in Galicia, with a new generation of enterprising 'narcos'. Nacho Carretero tells the incredible story of how this windswept and otherwise unremarkable corner of Spain became the cartels' gateway into Europe. Immersing himself in the life and history of the region, and interviewing everyone

from addicts and smugglers to crime bosses and DEA agents, Carretero's book is a riveting and often shocking account of drug running and narco violence at the very heart of Europe.

The Shadow

This book tells the story of a shadow who stabbed a man to death, was sentenced to twenty years in prison but escaped before he started serving his time. Rather than hiding away in some remote village or fleeing to another country, he camouflaged himself among the crowds in his home city of Barcelona, where he spent the next thirty years perfecting the art of hiding in plain sight: behind the bar, collecting his daughter from school, going on trips at the weekend. The secret of his anonymity was not to conceal himself but simply to go unnoticed. He became an ordinary man, consumed by paranoia, always on the lookout, a citizen who had no ID card, no health card, no social security number – something that was not so unusual in Spain in the 1980s and 1990s,

in a country in which, as long as they were properly oiled, the wheels kept turning.



I Don't Remember You

In 2018, during a visit to her family home in Germany, Laura Alzola Kirschgens found a folder with an inscription on its spine: Familiengeschichte – family history. The documents it contained, together with others conserved by her uncle, enabled the author to reconstruct a story with the Second World War at its epicentre. In particular, there were the letters her grandparents had exchanged over a period of four years, from 1944 to 1949, when they had not yet met in person, her grandfather was on the Eastern Front – and subsequently in a Soviet prison camp – and her grandmother was living in a German city that had been destroyed by bombs. The letters, which are

reproduced here, constitute a teenage love story against a tragic background.



Plans to Conquer Berlin

At the height of the Cold War, the Zionskirche, a Protestant church in East Berlin, organize a clandestine concert with the bands Die Firma and Element of Crime, a West Berlin group who had crossed the border a few hours earlier without informing the authorities of their intentions. At the end of the performance, the audience was subjected to a violent attack by a group of neo-Nazis. The police had been warned and arrived in time, but decided not to intervene. David Granda immerses himself in the Stasi archives, and weaves together the accounts of more than forty of the event's protagonists or witnesses, including political dissidents such as Rainer Eppelmann, first leader of the pacifist opposition movement in the GDR and its last Minister of Defence,

the singer Sven Regener, the punk guitarist Key Pankonin, artists, secret police informants and a Stasi officer responsible for monitoring cultural dissidence.



The Beginning. A reporter Stuck in Wuhan


At the end of January 2020, Jaime Santirso, correspondent of *El País* in China, flew to Wuhan to inform about the new coronavirus pandemic from its starting point. The morning after his arrival, Xi Jinping's government closed down the city with severe restrictions. Suddenly stuck and threatened by the illness, the reporter walked the streets in search of yearned answers but which neither the official channels nor the media had yet been able to provide. From his inmersion in the epicentre of the pandemic, his professional and personal effort to know, interpret and inform, priceless chronicles were born.



My Perestroika Ufo

A trip to the heart of Russia looking for the most alien news in history. On 9 October 1989, the Soviet Union's rather staid official new agency TASS released a remarkable story: in the city of Voronezh, some children said they had witnessed a ball of light landing on the ground, and two or three huge beings had emerged. It was the opening item on half the planet's news programmes and made headlines in the western press. Thirty years later, the author of this book – based in Moscow for two decades – became involved in an obsessive search for the protagonists of the news. In search of ufologists, journalists, scientists and eyewitnesses, the ex-correspondent would journey repeatedly to Voronezh to painstakingly reconstruct all the details of the "Soviet Roswell".



Blood Barrios. Dispatches from the World's Deadliest Streets

Marian Trimiar was a pioneer of women's boxing in the late 1970s. With her shaved head, some nicknamed her the Black Kojak, but she was in no mood to let anyone decide what to call her. She wanted a man's name: "Their dreams are my dreams," she said, and she chose her own ring name: "Lady Tyger". She wrote it with a y instead of an i because she thought it sounded more feminine. Cruz's text is both an affirmation of Trimiar's struggle and an elegant political analysis that draws the links between this female boxer and the liberation movement of those women whose only weapon was their bodies.

The Café on the Volcano

Berlin between the wars was a cultural and artistic melting pot. And its centre was the Romanisches Café. The place was already so famous that guided tours of the city stopped at the café. Visitors hoped to catch a glimpse of some of the leading figures of 20th century culture, including Zweig, Dietrich, Einstein, Wilder, Brecht or Benjamin, to name just a few. This convergence of artists and intellectuals, aroused the hatred of Goebbels, for whom the café became the symbol of everything that Nazism detested; and Goebbels made it his mission to persecute the café's customers with particular vigour. That was when Uzcanga decided to put the café at the centre of his book.





Sex accompanies us all from birth to death, but not all of us experience it in the same way.

Salomé has a degree, a doctorate and speaks four languages, but she has never experienced an orgasm. 
ALBERTO MAYOL

A very interesting reading of *The Godfather* as a treatise on realpolitik in a Machiavellian key, with fifty keys or laws that would serve to explain the contemporary conception of power (how to achieve it, how to maintain it, how to transmit it to the following generations), but a book far from being satisfied with a superficial and utilitarian reading of a mythological universe which the author always treats with the greatest respect.


Against Sustainability
