

What inspired me to write this story

As a child, I lived in West Sussex, very close to Knepp, now a rewilding centre. My father was a nature poet and countryman who knew the birds and their songs and where to watch wildlife. He took me and my sisters out at night to watch badgers and bats, to hear nightingales sing, and see the barn owl feed its young. My mother taught us the names of the butterflies and flowers and showed us the secret woodland places where rare orchids grew, and wild daffodils bloomed in the spring.

Now I live in a city, and I see the countryside of my childhood vanishing and children today missing out on the natural world I took for granted. In this book, I want to inspire children to connect with the natural world and the hope felt when we see it undoing some of the damage done.







The Little White Sprite


With delicate watercolour illustrations, this is a gentle story showing a mysterious and magical friendship.
